URL	A URL (Uniform or Universal Resource Locator) is a link on the internet to a website or online file.		
	Teachers can use the URL module to provide their students with web links for research, saving the		
	student time and effort in manually typing out the address. The URLS can be displayed in various ways -		
	see URL module settings for example, opening in a new window so a student can access and use the
